REVIEW OF APRIL 05, 2018 JAPC NOTES

The Committee reviewed the notes.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

ACCIDENT ANALYSIS

The committee was provided with the LA/LB injury summary report covering 3/20/2018 to 04/13/2018 [pmap5060]. The report listed 9 LT and 43 NLT injuries for LA/LB. Direct employers provided additional information on 11 of the injuries. Members were reminded to review the injury report and follow-up with either the employer or the Secretary if additional information/details are requested.

Several Employers were absent from the meeting, and the injury information will be forward after the meeting.

SERIOUS ACCIDENTS

1. The Committee discussed injury report information and obtaining accurate location and time data.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Emergency Signage / Fire Department SubCommittee

[Held Over]. The Secretary noted a draft letter is being developed request POLB assistance in fire boat landing locations.

2. Working at Heights SubCommittee

The Secretary noted a draft paper will be developed and presented to the Committee. [Held Over].

3. Wind Best Practice Document

The Secretary noted a draft paper is currently being reviewed and presented to the Committee. [Held Over].

4. Fuel Barge Refueling

The Union requested the Bunker Barge BPD be placed in the terminal foremen's office. [Held Over].

5. Emergency Action Plans (EAP)

The Union asked about Employer EAP's and procedures following a terminal incident. The Union requested the remaining terminals provide copies for review.

The Employers requested the Union not to widely release EAP's as the information in the plans is also found in facility security documents provided to USCG.

A discussion continued on emergency planning for situations involving Terminal Island evacuation and active shooter emergencies / evacuations.

6. Terminal Map Booklet

The Foremen representative requested a POLA & POLB terminal map booklet be collected. [Held Over].

7. Radio Procedure Protocol

An Employer representative provided details following a recent sub-committee meeting. A flyer will be produced with recommendations from the meeting.

The notes from the subcommittee were provided to PMA to develop a Coast STF. [Held Over].

8. Safety Shoe Voucher

[Prior Meeting]. The longshore representative asked what happens to the funds if all shoe vouchers are not used.

The Secretary noted that funds are not earmarked to be returned (as PMA is not the government), but if under budget then additional assessment funding does not have to be requested from PMA Members.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Foremen Medical Bag

The Foremen safety representative requested a medical bag (FA supplies and AED) be provided to the Ship Boss for use during vessel operations.

2. ILWU Proposal on Formal Red Tag

A Local 63 safety representative presented the Committee with a Red Tag sticker that can be affixed to vehicles in need of repair.

3. Container Gantry Crane Near Dock Slow Down

Local 13 crane operators noted that a POLB container terminal recently changed the crane near dock slow down settings on several cranes, but did not notify the steady crane operators of the change.
